



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Section One

1. Profile of the College

Radha Govinda Baruah College was established on July 15, 1978 with the noble aim of spreading the light of knowledge in what was then a remote corner of Guwahati. The college was named after the "architect of modern Assam" *Xingha Purush* Radha Govinda Baruah, a person *nonpareil* in the annals of Assam, whose contributions in the field of media, culture and sports are second to none. Over the years the college has made rapid strides and is now a leading institution of higher education in the city offering many courses of study, with the ideals and values of the great personality whose name it proudly bears deeply embedded in its learning ecosystem.

In its initial years, the college functioned from a makeshift arrangement in Natun Fatasil Town High School with only a handful of students and teachers. The college shifted to its present campus in 1986 and was soon brought under the deficit grants-in-aid system of the Government of Assam in 1990. Along with other colleges of Assam, the Arts stream was also provincialised when the system was introduced by the Government of Assam in 2006. Subsequently, the Commerce stream was provincialised in 2013. The college is permanently affiliated to Gauhati University and is under the purview of Section 2 (F) and 12 (B) of the University Grants Commission Act 1956. The college has completed two cycles of NAAC accreditation and is gearing for the third cycle. At present, the college has 14 departments imparting quality education at the Higher Secondary and Undergraduate levels to more than 2000 students across a wide range of programmes.

The college can boast of having a committed team of experienced and young faculty whose role in giving shape to the life and career of the students cannot be stressed enough. With great passion and patience, the teachers have successfully drawn out the students' latent talents and abilities. Students with poor to modest academic careers at the entry-level have shown marked improvement in their results at the undergraduate level. - 2. How to Apply
- Student seeking admission into the various courses/ programmes in the College must apply through the SAMARTH portal only.
- Admission to the B.A/B.Com course is held after the announcement of HS IInd Yr (Arts/ Commerce) examination result.
- The dates of admission to various classes are notified in the local newspapers and the college website.
- Admission to the college is made strictly in order of merit and is governed by the college admission rules.

- All admissions made are provisional and subject to the approval of the G.U. The college is not responsible if the G.U. does not approve the admission of any student on grounds of non submission of Migration Certificate/ Eligibility fees or for furnishing wrong or false documents and statements.
- The following documents are to be produced at the time of admission.
- i. Admit card and original mark sheet of the last examination passed.
- ii. Two passport size photographs of the candidate.
- iii. Caste certificate where necessary.
- iv. Gap certificate where necessary.
- v. Proficiency Certificate for Extra-curricular Activities as applicable
- vi. Migration certificate where necessary.
- The decision of the College Authority regarding all admissions is final. The College authority reserves the right to refuse admission to any one without citing any reason.
- Selected candidates must get themselves admitted just after the interview by making the requisite payments.
- Admission to any course of the college may be cancelled at any time if any information furnished

by the candidate at the time of admission is found to be incorrect.

Section Four

General Information

A. Rules and Regulations

1. Commencement of Classes

The classes for the newly-admitted students of H.S. First Year and B.A./B.Com First Semester for the session 2024-25 will commence according to the academic session of AHSEC and Gauhati University. The dates will be notified in the college website.

2. College Hours

Classes start at 9.00 A.M. and end at 5.00 P.M.

3. Academic Calendar

The college academic calendar is prepared in conformity with the academic calendar of Gauhati University. Information regarding the commencement of classes, schedule of examinations, dates of college events, vacations and holidays are available in the academic calendar. It can be downloaded by the students from the college website.

4. Students' Class Attendance

Students' class attendance is strictly monitored by the college. Each student is required to attend a minimum of 75% of the total classes held in each subject to be eligible for appearing in the Council/University examinations, academic awards, election to the Students' Union or scholarships.

5. Forfeiture of Admission

If a student fails to attend classes for 15 days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes, his/her seat is liable to be forfeited and the vacant seats will be filled up from the waiting list.

6. Orientation Programme

An orientation programme for newly-admitted students is held usually on the first day of the session unless otherwise specified. All students must compulsorily attend the programme.

7. College Code of Conduct and Discipline

- A student must maintain proper discipline and a cordial atmosphere in the college campus, and behave appropriately with the Principal, faculty, office staff and other students of the College.
- A student must not cause any damage/ defacement to any property which belongs to the College; such an action will allow the College to impose a monitory fine on him/her and/or cancel his/her admission or may take any legal action against him/her.
- A student will not indulge in any illegal, unlawful or criminal activity, ragging, misconduct, fraud nor will get involved in the consumption of intoxicating substances in the College premises.
- A student must not adopt any kind of unfair means in the examination hall, doing which will invite strict disciplinary action against him, including expulsion from the examination/s.
- A student would attend College in the prescribed college uniform and carry and display his/her Identity Card issued by the College, every day.
- A student should participate in extension, cocurricular and extra-curricular activities, including community service.
- A student must not participate in any Dharna/ Pradarshan/Strike; such actions can lead to strict disciplinary action against him/her including his/her rustication from the College.
- A student will park his/her vehicle/bicycle only in the designated parking place entirely at his/ her own risk and in case of any unfortunate event like theft, damage, loss etc. he/she will not claim any compensation from the College.
- A student should always abide by the rules and circulars issued by the College from time to time.

8. Undertaking by the Parent/ Legal Guardian

The parents/ legal guardian of the student will have to give an undertaking in the prescribed form at the time of submission of form for admission in the college to the effect that his/ her ward, if admitted, shall attend requisite number of classes, appear in each of the examinations of the college and maintain discipline and decorum of the college. A student violating these stipulations shall be liable for punishment even leading to the extent of forced transfer/expulsion from the college.

9. College Uniform

College uniform must be compulsorily worn in a proper manner by all students. No student is permitted to wear any other dress in the college campus, except on the days of college cultural/ sports events, if notified. Students must get their uniforms stitched from the empanelled vendor/ merchant store only.

10. Identity Card

The college authority issues an identity card at the time of admission to every student. This card is non-transferable. It contains vital information about the holder viz.name, class, roll no., combination of subject and a passport-size photograph duly attested and signed by the Principal. Every student is expected to carry the card with him/her at all times.

B. Facilities

Infrastructural Facilities

1. College Library

The college has a well-organized library with a good stock of text books, reference books and other valuable books related to different subjects. A large number of Journals, Magazines & Periodicals including Newspapers are also stocked in the library. Students are issued one library card for pass course and two library cards for major courses. Renewal of the library card and reservation facilities is also available. Borrowers must return the books within fifteen days from the date of issue of the books. An overdue charge of Re 1/- per book per day, will be levied if the book is kept beyond the due date of return. A borrower will be responsible for the loss or damage of any book borrowed from the college library. An orientation programme on the use of library is conducted for the newly-admitted students at the beginning of the academic session. A new library building is nearing completion and set to be opened soon.

2. Boys' Hostel

The College has a 15 Seated Boys' Hostel which is named after Binoy Bhusan Choudhury the Renowned Personality of Assam. Every room of the hostel is well equiped with all modren amenities

3. Laboratories

The College has a Computer Laboratory with 30 nos. of PC. Internet facility is available in the laboratory. The College authority has dicided to provide orientation on basic Computer application to its students free of cost. The Department of Education has a well-equipped psychological laboratory for carrying out the practical activities.

4. Spaces for Meetings, Functions and Conferences

The college has some dedicated spaces for organizing various events and functions. An air-conditioned conference room accommodating 60 persons and a seminar hall of 200 people capacity are used for organizing academic meetings and conferences. College cultural functions are held in the Parag Sarma Memorial Open Stage.

5. Yoga and Wellness Centre

The college has started the process of creating a dedicated Yoga and Wellness Centre for the mental and spiritual well-being of its students. Various yoga and meditation programmes are to be conducted by the centre.

6. Canteen

The R.G.Baruah College Cafeteria is open throughout the day and provides various food items at an affordable rate for students and staff in a hygienic environment.

7. Drinking Water

Safe drinking water is available for students in a water-station built for the purpose.

8. Common Rooms for Boys and Girls The college has a common room for boys with facilities for indoor games. The girls' common room has attached washrooms.

9. Play Ground

The college playground is being developed in a phased manner. Once completed, it will be used for outdoor sports like football, cricket, etc.

10. Green Campus

The college campus has many varieties of trees and plants providing a green cover in the campus. Regular plantation drives, restriction in the use of plastic and other eco-friendly measures ensure a cool and serene environment for the students and staff.

11. Smart Class Room

Student Support Facilities

1. Information and Career Guidance Cell (ICGC)

Since its formation in 2001, the Information and Career Guidance Cell has been functioning with the aim of providing students information about various career avenues and self-employment opportunities, especially in the domain of entrepreneurship. Regular training and awareness programmes are organised by the Cell.

2. Placement Cell

A placement cell has been started by the college from the current academic session with the objective of holding placement drives and job fairs in the college campus for the benefit of the students.

3. Extension Education Cell

In an endeavour to carry out the objective of providing emotional support to the inmates of the Children's Home for Boys (Social Welfare Department, Government of Assam), the faculty members along with the students of the college has been organising various interactive cum counselling sessions for the inmates. The cell is also involved in carrying out many other outreach activities in the neighbouring community.

4. Mentor-Mentee System

A mentor-mentee system is in place in the college for helping students in academic and other matters. All permanent teachers are involved in the practice and act as mentors for their allotted students.

5. Academic Doubt Clearing Day (ADCD)




