5.1 Course - XI: Classical Political Philosophy

Course objective:

5.2 Course – XII: Indian Political Thought-I

The basic focus of study is on individual thinkers whose ideas are however framed by specific themes. The course as a whole is meant to provide a sense of the broad streams of Indian thought while encouraging a specific knowledge of individual thinkers and texts.
